COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE AND THE ROLE OF ADVISORY SERVICES

From civil engineering (Ba) and Science and Innovationmanagement (Msc) Jeroen worked his main career in sustainability and innovation in the construction sector. He left his previous position in the circular economy transition team of the National Highways following his agricultural heart to work on improving the Dutch AKIS.

The presentation gives you an insight in the current Dutch National Innovation System, functions needed to make the AKIS(es) more successful. One of the key functions is knowledge exchange. The first priority of the Dutch national CoP is to accelerate knowledge flowing in the AKIS, from and towards the farmers. We plan to work together with exiting thematical CoPs in order to improve structural interaction to defragment the Dutch AKIS.



PAUL DANIËLS,

Advisors (VAB), Amersfoort, Netherlands

Born as a city dweller in 1968, Paul is father to a 22-year old son and has lost his heart to rural areas and to farmers that shape their landscape and provide their daily food. After studying economics and commerce, he has spent 33 years in project management and communication management for various service-driven organizations for agriculture in almost all branches. For the last ten years, he has worked as secretary general/project manager at VAB.

In the exceptional advisory landscape in NL, a gap was created between research (theoretical, public-supported knowledge) and advisors (practical, market-driven knowledge). At present, this brings the challenge of reconnecting, and VAB attempts to stimulate advisors to willingly participate more in project research and make the results from them more applicable in common practice. To stimulate this, we bring value to the required Lifelong Learning demands for certified advisors, as well as activate all stakeholders to work towards a level playing field of understanding. The challenge is to get advisors for at least a limited time of their advisory work from their customers on board in research projects to optimize knowledge flow.

Simona presents an innovative approach to peer-to-peer learning among advisors that was developed by i2connect project. This approach helps to deepen into the experiences of innovation support services, understanding competencies need and sharing practical solutions applied by advisors.

CROSS VISITS: INCREASING FARMERS' SHARE IN THE FOOD VALUE CHAIN THROUGH DIGITAL SERVICES

Peter is project leader for European projects at ZLTO farmers organization. He has experience with projects on the broad spectrum of challenges that farmers and their organizations face. In the last few years, he has focused on data and technology, because these promise great advantages to do more with less. His work was always focused on optimizing the AKIS for farmers; as advisor and in regional, national and EU projects.

Peter highlights the unique impact of cross visits, which he experienced in the projects Agrispin (innovation systems), AgridemoF2F/Nefertiti (demonstrations on farm), FAIRshare (use of digital tools), i2connect (interactive innovation) and others. Cross visits are international visits where 5–10 visitors go to a practical innovation 'in the field' and evaluate it in a respectful dialogue with the organizers. Both visitors and organizers have a great learning experience, get new ideas and expand their network.

The modernAKIS Project

modernAKIS (www.modernakis.eu), a seven year Horizon Europe project covering all 27 EU Member States, aims to improve the capacities of AKIS actors to leverage their individual, organizational and systemic resources to drive transformation towards more coherent, effective and AKIS systems and the transition to a more sustainable management and use of natural resources in farming and forestry.

The project offers more than 50 capacity building events, 40 networking events, 7 AKIS training modules, a network and online community of AKIS actors (www.akisconnect.eu), engaged in sharing experiences and peer learning.
